East coast fishing reports 2018

Shutterstock scientists have studied what makes people stray for years, and now new research claims that there is another factor: geography. A new survey of more than 2,000 people conducted by online legal services marketplace Avvo suggests that people who live on the West Coast are more likely to be scammers. According to the survey, 20 percent of Western coasters say they cheated on a partner, compared with 17 percent of Southerners, 16 percent in the Northeast and 10 percent of Midwesterners. RELATED: 6 Signs It's Probably Cheating on You Men were also more likely to cop to get some on the side, with 20 percent of those surveyed saying they had sex with someone who wasn't their partner. (On the other hand, 13 percent of women said they cheated.) But back to the west coast... What's this all about? Licensed clinical psychologist Ramani Durvasula, Ph.D., says it may be more about where on the West Coast most survey respondents lived. If people in major cities participated, she is not shocked by the findings. These cities are filled with transplants, she says. Very personality traits that lead to someone moving are likely to lead to more openness, and that can also lead to more moral behavior such as deception. She notes that Los Angeles in particular may have a higher-than-usual level of scams, since it is a creative city that may be more populated by those who are higher on the grounds of openness, which may be more likely to lead to infidelity. Of course, psychiatrist Gail Saltz, M.D., author of *The Anatomy of a Secret Life: The Psychology of Life's Lies*, points out that infidelity happens everywhere, and people who live on the West Coast shouldn't suddenly freak out and assume that their partner will cheat. (And the opposite is true, too, the Midwesterners shouldn't be super complacent about their apparent lack of cheating.) She says other factors are much more likely to increase the risk that a person will cheat, such as whether they have grown up with infidelity in their family, if they are in a much more liberal environment where many people don't get married, and if there is a lot of cheating going on around them. It will change your perception of how good it is to be unfaithful, she says. ANSWER: If they cheated once, will they cheat again? Of course, not cheating is good, and it sucks that anyone reports doing it. But there is a positive side to the study: almost 95 percent of respondents say they are happy in their relationship. So... From New York to quebec, there is an abundance of ski resorts along the East Coast that combine the great terrain with family entertainment. In fact, some of the best east coast skiing may be just a short drive from your hometown, making these resorts the perfect place to go on a snowy weekend away. You can go from city to slopes in just two and a half hours on Mount Wyndham, which feels like it's a world away, even though it's close to New York. Or head to Mont Tremblant in quebec to feel that you have gone to Europe without jet lag. This winter, plan a vacation to hit the slopes at one of the nine best East Coast ski resorts. About two and a half hours from Boston, this Vermont ski resort has 98 percent snow cover (thanks to snow-fighting) with the ski season going from early November all the way to mid-April. The resort also offers intermediate and advanced skiers and snowboarders free mountain tours and holidays, so you can learn 121 different mountain routes, slopes and glades. Find it: Okemo, 77 Okemo Ridge Road, Ludlow, VT About an hour and a half from Montreal, this skiing spot travels the distance to several U.S. cities, but it feels like a distant French Alpine village. Ski or snowboard through 102 different different extends over 755 acres, ideal for any skill level. After a long day of skiing, take a free open-air gondola to the base of the village and stroll around the city, stopping in charming shops and capturing Bvertal (or Queues de Castor in French), a sweet fried dough topped with cinnamon and sugar or chocolate hazelnuts. Find it: Tremblant, 1000 Chemin des Voyageurs, Mont Tremblant, Canada This Lake Placid resort offers skiers and riders 87 pistes over 22 miles, with 62 percent of pistes aimed at intermediate or beginner skill levels. When they don't hit the slopes, thrill seekers can ride the Olympic bobsleigh track, and history buffs can check out the Lake Placid Olympic Museum. In February, this East Coast ski resort will celebrate 40 years since the 1980 Winter Olympics and Miracle on Ice. In honor of this exciting event, the resort plans to light the original Olympic cauldron of 1980, hold free ice skating with Olympians, offer dance parties at Olympic ski jumping, and more. Find it: Whiteface Mountain, 5021 Route 86, Wilmington, Ny A combination of luxurious and easy-to-ski trails, this New Hampshire resort offers visitors 97 trails and meadows to explore over 464 ski acres (including five trails that open at night). For most of the winter season, you can take a three-hour tour of the snow-capped treetops or ride a horse sleigh. After a day of skiing, head to the Slopeside pub to ski or bring the kids to your own themed apres-ski parties. Find it: Bretton Woods, 99 Ski Area Road, Bretton Woods, NH Sugarloaf is one of the best East Coast ski resorts for those looking for an adventurous winter break. More than 1,200 ski acres await at this Maine resort, with 163 trails and clearings (57 percent of which are ideal for beginners and intermediate skill levels). Looking for an even more challenge? Try cat skiing, where a snow cat takes you to the top of Burnt Mountain for a unique skiing experience. For different types of adrenaline, try a fat bike through snow-covered forests or head indoors to an anti-gravity complex where you can jump on giant trampolines and tackle climbing walls. Find it: Sugarloaf, 5092 Sugarloaf Access Road, Carrabassett Valley, ME This Vermont resort offers incredibly diverse terrain for its 116 different pistes: 16 percent are considered beginners, 55 percent for intermediates, and 29 percent for expert level skiers and snowboarders. There's even a cross-country center where you can explore nearly 28 miles of manicured trails and more than 18 miles from the backcountry area. Later, head to nearby Burlington (about 40 minutes away) You can pop into some of the best craft breweries around. Find it: Stowe, 5781 Mountain Road, Stowe, VT This resort has seven mountainous areas, with Killington Peak towering above the rest with a height of 4,241 feet - meaning you'll be skiing for quite some time to get these mountains. In addition, the resort's ability to cover 600 acres of ski land with its snow system compliments the 250 inches of natural snowfall it receives each year, making it one of the best ski resorts in New England for fresh powder. When you're not skiing, strap on the outdoor Beast Mountain Coaster, a 4,800-foot alpine coaster featuring a 360-degree corkscrew, or take in mountain views with a leisurely ride on a scenic gondola. Find it: Killington Resort, 4763 Killington Road, Killington, VT This mountain is just a few hours north of New York City, but it feels like you're far from the hustle and bustle of the Big Apple. It's smaller than some of the other East Coast ski resorts with only 54 pistes, but its size makes it feel manageable and family-friendly - plus, the mountain offers 45 acres of night skiing on six trails, so you don't have to rush off the slopes when it gets dark. While there, head to the Catskill Mountain Country Store and restaurant for some country charm with plenty to entertain the kids. Find it: Windham Mountain Resort, 19 Resort Drive, Windham, NY A whopping 80 percent of the pistes at this New Hampshire resort are reserved for beginners and intermediate skiers and snowboarders, making it one of the best East Coast ski destinations for those just learning. And for people wanting to hone their skills, there are six landscape parks for all levels, including two for children. When you're not skiing, try zip-lining 700 feet across the Pemigewasset River (open all four seasons), or steer your inner child and go snow tube Find it: Loon Mountain Resort, 60 Loon Mountain Road, Lincoln, N.H. ©.
